#### Focus Your Life on the Risen Christ

Colossians 3:1-4

1. To focus your life, you must remember who you are in Christ.
A. You have to the old life. (verse 3)

#### Application

So how can you keep your life focused on the risen Christ? Consider these practical suggestions:


**Live with a resurrection mindset.** Each morning remind yourself: "I have died with Christ, and I have been raised with Him. My life today is hidden with Christ in God." This re-centers your identity before the day's distractions begin.

**Examine your affections.** Ask: What do I love most? What excites me, worries me, drives me? If your heart is captured by earthly things more than by Christ, it's time to reset.

**Discipline your thoughts.** Choose to meditate on God's truth, His promises, His character. Philippians 4:8 gives a great filter: "whatever is true, noble, right, pure, lovely, admirable—think on these things".

**Stay eternity-focused.** Let the reality of Christ's return shape your daily decisions. Would this choice matter in light of His coming? Would this pursuit hold value in eternity?

**Walk in daily obedience to God's will.** He has revealed His will in His Word: love Him with all your heart, love your neighbor, live holy and godly lives.
