Pastor Steven’s Doctoral Project
How does First Baptist Church embody its commitment to “a grace that welcomes openly” as it relates to the addicted person? How do we work with other providers (counselors, rehab centers, and support groups) to help fill our piece of the puzzle as it comes to recovery for addicted persons? How can we be the hands and feet of Jesus to offer healing and restoration to a hurting segment of our larger population? These are the questions that I am seeking to address in my doctoral work through Fuller Theological Seminary. Over the next few months, you will hear more about this research as I implement my project here at FBC Griffin. I am currently looking for a small group of individuals who feel a “calling” to support addicted individuals to participate in an educational workshop. This eight-week educational workshop will meet on Wednesday nights from 6:00-8:00 at the church and we will look at the experience of addiction through the lens of faith.
