# Sermon Notes

Matthew 11:16-19; 25-30  
*Whose Yoke Are You Sharing?*  
Steven Norris, preaching

Each of us carries with us concerns that either help us walk the way of Jesus or hinder us from walking the way. Take time this week to reflect on your own mental, emotional, relational, and spiritual luggage and ask Jesus to show how you might take his yoke upon you.

- **What is taking up the most space in your mental and emotional backpack right now?** Is it worry about money, concern for your reputation, resentment toward someone, regret over a past decision, pressure to succeed, or something else? What evidence do you see that you are carrying it every day?
- **What are you working hard to protect, prove, or control that Jesus never asked you to carry?** Are you trying to protect your image, prove your worth, secure your future, control outcomes, or manage other people’s opinions of you? How much energy is that consuming?
- **If Jesus’ yoke is simply loving God and loving your neighbor, what in your life makes that harder?** What habits, commitments, fears, assumptions, or obligations are so heavy that they leave little room for love, joy, compassion, or attentiveness to God?
- **What is one specific burden you could hand over to Jesus this week, and what concrete action would show that you have done so?** If the burden is worry, perhaps you stop checking something obsessively. If it is a grudge, perhaps you begin a conversation. If it is busyness, perhaps you cancel an unnecessary commitment. What would trusting Jesus with that burden actually look like in practice?

<sup>16</sup> “To what can I compare this generation? It is like children playing a game in the public square. They complain to their friends, <sup>17</sup> ‘We played wedding songs, and you didn’t dance, so we played funeral songs, and you didn’t mourn.’ <sup>18</sup> For John didn’t spend his time eating and drinking, and you say, ‘He’s possessed by a demon.’ <sup>19</sup> The Son of Man, on the other hand, feasts and drinks, and you say, ‘He’s a glutton and a drunkard, and a friend of tax collectors and other sinners!’ But wisdom is shown to be right by its results.” [...] <sup>25</sup> At that time Jesus prayed this prayer: “O Father, Lord of heaven and earth, thank you for hiding these things from those who think themselves wise and clever, and for revealing them to the childlike. <sup>26</sup> Yes, Father, it pleased you to do it this way! <sup>27</sup> “My Father has entrusted everything to me. Let me teach you, because I am humble and gentle at heart, and you will find rest for your souls. <sup>30</sup> For my yoke is easy to bear, and the burden I give you is light.”
